StepByStep Recovery's residential program provides services to the homeless and men and women suffering from drug and alcohol addiction. The residential program provides a safe and structured environment while educating the participant about the disease of addiction and the coping and life skills needed in order to stay clean and become a productive member of society. Residents live in one of six units provided b StepByStep. These units each provide bedroom, bath room, kitchen facilities as well as a living area.

StepByStep Recovery's residential program is six months to two years for men and women over the age of 18. The program utilizes a three phase modality that helps residents achieve their goals in recovery and ongoing lives.
